WHAT IS CIVIL LEGAL AID?

Sometimes difficult things happen in life, like losing a job, facing eviction from a home or experiencing a trauma like domestic violence or sexual assault. Many people having these experiences could benefit from legal help, but they don't know where to turn or can't afford a lawyer.

Civil legal aid is a combination of free services and resources that nonprofit organizations provide to people who can't afford legal help otherwise. A lawyer can help you navigate the confusing legal system to see if there is a legal solution that can help you improve your situation. Civil legal aid is not the same as criminal representation. This is not intended to be a resource for people who are being accused of a crime.

Everyone should have legal help when facing a crisis. Find out if civil legal aid can help you. For immediate help, call 2-1-1 in King County.



DOMESTIC VIOLENCE



ARE YOU WORRIED ABOUT YOUR SAFETY? IS SOMEONE YOU LOVE HURTING YOU OR YOUR CHILDREN?

There is help if you are experiencing or have recently experienced domestic violence.

Nonprofit organizations in King County provide legal resources to assist survivors of domestic violence. Trained, professional staff can help you identify options to help protect you and your children.

Some organizations provide resources and can explain the legal process to you. Other organizations also provide legal representation to help you in the courtroom. The type of legal assistance varies by organization and may also include things like drafting important documents for court, coaching you for court appearances, developing legal strategies and referring you to other services.

SEXUAL ASSAULT

IF YOU HAVE BEEN SEXUALLY ASSAULTED OR RAPED, THERE IS HELP.

Legal help is available if you are a survivor of sexual assault or rape. Nonprofit organizations in King County provide free legal services to help you navigate your options and create a safety plan.

Services vary by organization and may include things like discussing your options for reporting the crime, acting as your liaison, explaining your legal rights, helping you tell your story the way you want it told, accompanying you to interviews or court hearings and referring you to other services. Legal advocacy services are confidential and free of charge.

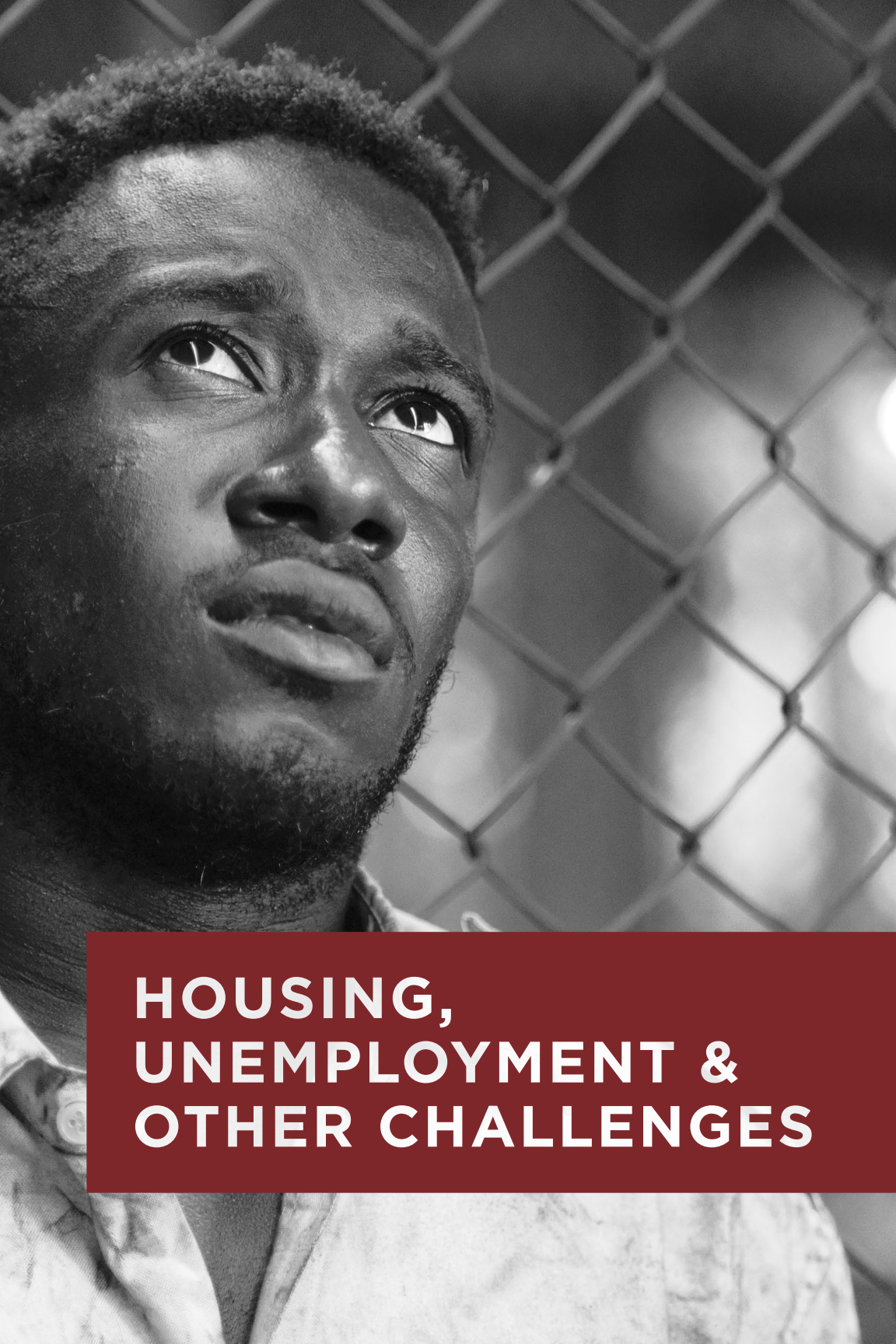

GET FREE CIVIL LEGAL HELP.

Resources are available if you are facing eviction, unemployment or other challenges that are affecting your health, stability or well-being.

Everyone should have access to legal advice when they are facing a serious life obstacle. Nonprofit organizations in King County provide free civil legal aid for issues like these:

- Do you have legal questions about your safety, family situation, job or housing?
- Is your landlord trying to evict you?
- Are you having trouble with your boss or in your workplace?
- Are you having debt issues or considering bankruptcy?
- Have you been declined Social Security or Medicare/Medicaid benefits?
- Do you want to get a divorce or have questions about child custody or child support?
- Are you facing discrimination as an LGBTQ individual?
- Do you have questions about your immigration status?
- Do you have another non-criminal legal issue?

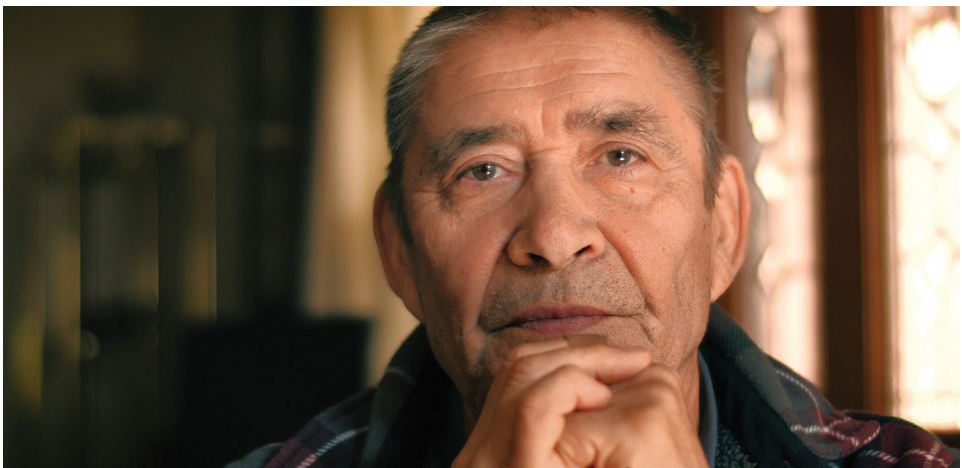
